North American and Northern Pacific common and these stocks were unusually active. A break in Chicago Gas, however, changed the temper of speculation, and in the last hour of business there was a general desire to sell. The trades were actively engaged in depressing Chicago Gas and Whisky, and in raising their operations reports were circulated that the seigniorage bill would be placed on the statute and that exports of gold to Europe next week would be on a large scale. Chicago Gas fell 1/2 to 67 1/2, whisky to 90 1/2, sugar to 10 1/2, cordage to 2 1/2, and the other prominent stocks 1/4 to 1/2. In the final dealing there was a slight recovery and the market left off steadily. Total sales for the day were 97,000 shares.
