TO COMMENCE MANUFACTURE SOON

Capitalization Said to Approach Two Million Dollars in Stock Held Mostly by Scranton People—Board of Directors has been Elected—Process Protected by Numerous Patents—Machinery Enroute.

Another evidence of Scranton enterprise and progressiveness is shown in the formation of the Bonta Bridge Glass company, which was organized Tuesday night at the office of Dr. David B. Hand, 206 Penn. avenue, and the following board of directors elected: Dr. David B. Hand, president; William McClave, vice-president; Henry Howell, secretary; Charles D. Simpson and Dr. Shakspeare and J. W. Bonta of Philadelphia.

A title has been secured from Colonel H. M. Boies to fourteen acres of land at Moosic, and ground for the buildings will be begun today or tomorrow. The cars are now loaded at Wilmington, D. H., with the rolling machinery and appliances included in Mr. Bonta's patent. They will be forwarded here immediately.
