South, it was in 1891 officially recognized by the Methodist General conference.

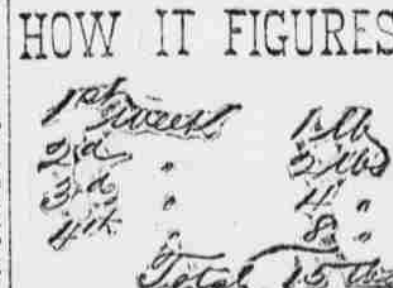
