GENERAL NEWS OF INDUSTRIES

The East Side Electric railroad from Wilkes-Barre to Pittston has reached Port Griffith. The latest in regard to what route the company will use to Port Griffith is that they will lay one track on the main road and a second track on the road being opened through the Pennsylvania Coal company's ground.

Ex-United States Senator Patterson, from Millerton, who represented South Carolina during the carpet bag days, called on Governor and Corporation Clerk Van Dyke at Harrisburg the other day. He is the promoter of the Pennsylvania Traction company, which proposes to run its road from Philadelphia to Harrisburg. They intend commencing operations in Philadelphia, branching off the main line to West Chester and other points in that locality.

The shipments of coal over the Hazleton and Broad Top railroad last week aggregated 55,955 tons, against 47,355 tons for the corresponding period last year, an increase of 8,600 tons.

There has, says the Record, been a great deal of rumor recently in regard to the resuscitation of the long talked of Williamsport and Binghamton railroad. Several Valley officials were in Montrose and vicinity recently, looking over the route, which has all been surveyed. From Montrose south the narrow gauge would be widened, extended up Bowman's creek to connect with the Harvey's Lake branch, which runs direct to Williamsport.

The running of passenger trains on the Wilkes-Barre and Eastern railroad will begin on Monday, June 4. Two trains to and from New York will be run each day. The first will leave Wilkes-Barre about 7 o'clock in the morning and the second about 6 in the evening.

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL

NEW YORK, May 1.—Realizations on a liberal scale in American Sugar had a tendency to weaken the market for stocks in the early dealings. Sugar opened slightly lower at 10 1/2, and then fell to 10 1/4, this was the heaviest decline, the other industries received about 1/2 to 3/4. The drop in Sugar brought in refresh buying orders notwithstanding the heavy realizations, and the stock moved up to 10 3/4, re-acted to 10 1/2 and left off at 10 1/4, a loss of 1/4 for the day.

Lead was the weakest of the group. Chicago was on a moderate business, gained about a point, selling up to 63. The railway list was not affected to any great extent by the industrial, held firm until just near the close, when there was a short in the Grangers, led by Burlington and Quincy which gained 1/2. St. Paul was advanced to 63 1/2, Rock Island to 62 1/2 and Northwest to 100. Reading was a weak spot, falling from 19 to 17 1/2.
