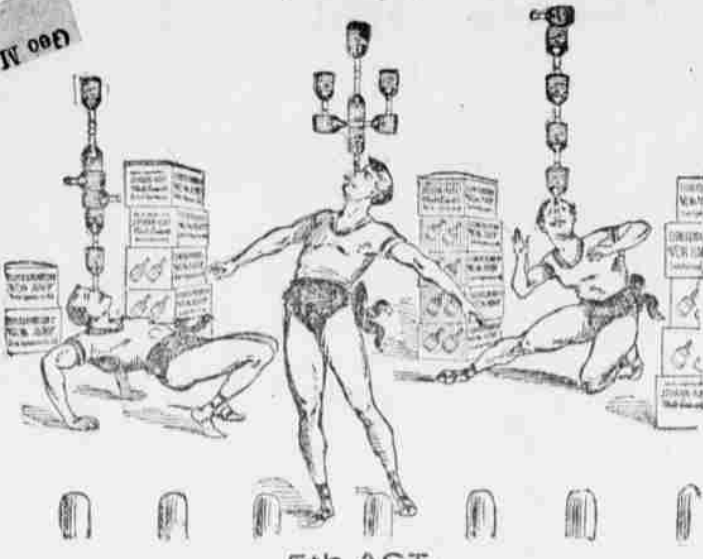

DOWNED BY KING KELLY

Allentown's State League Team Runs Away from the Locals. OUPLEADED BY THE OLD TIMERS

The Ten Thousand Dollar Beauty Actor-Base Ball Player and His Companions Put Up a Very High Grade Game of Ball—High Winds Make Fielding Very Difficult and in One Instance Crowd Scattered Four Runs. A Large Crowd Thoroughly Disgusted by the Locals' Poor Showing.

The two thousand persons who filled out of Hogan Park at the conclusion of the Scranton-Allentown game yesterday afternoon, were a very much disgusted crowd. They had witnessed the home team put up a game that would shame many an academic nine.

Nine ossified men could have played as good a game as was put up by the Scrantons. They showed quite plainly that team work was an unknown feature of the game to them. Swift secured a couple of points of ginger and gave each player a dose. A few more such instances as yesterday's will do much toward killing base ball in Scranton from a financial standpoint.

The strong wind that prevailed during the game undoubtedly caused the fielders great trouble in judging fly balls. This was particularly noticeable in the fourth inning. The visitors had three men on bases, with two men out. Kilroy popped up a fly that to all appearances was destined to drop near second base.

Of course Kelly and his team were gazed upon with much admiration and wonder, especially by the younger portion of the crowd. The king was in good humor, and when he came to the bat in the third inning he was loudly cheered. The ex-actor snatched off his cap, bowed to the crowd and struck out.

The Scrantons first scored in the second inning. After Rogers had fired to Browning, Massey singled and came home when Wood hit Westlake's long drive got by him. Staltz struck out and Browning captured Higgins' hit to center. Allentown got two in the second on Miller's two-base hit, Melvay's single, Moran's sacrifice and Sweeney's out at first.
