quarterly conventions. This money will come out of the union treasury.

NEW INSURANCE PLAN. The plan contemplates a graded insurance for persons between the age of 21 and 55 years of age.

After disposing of the work of the constitutional committee the report of the committee on resolutions was read by John H. Foy, and adopted.

THE DELEGATES ELECTED. It required two hours and a half to select the delegates, five ballots being taken.

The trophy question was again brought before the convention and precipitated the most exciting debate of the session.

Resolved, That we view with gratification the fact that the efforts now being made by our National Union to extend the cause of total abstinence...

Resolved, That we extend our most hearty congratulations to our beloved Bishop, Rt. Rev. William O'Hara, upon the preservation of his health and pray that he may be spared for many years to exercise his fatherly care and benign influence...

Resolved, That the thanks of this convention are due and are hereby extended to our esteemed spiritual father, Rev. E. J. Malloy, for his presence, advice and counsel during our deliberations...

When the convention reassembled the work of electing officers was taken up and C. G. Boland obtained the recognition of the chair. He said:

I arise to perform the pleasant duty of offering for reelection to the union brother who has been tried and not found wanting; a brother who has filled the office for the past year so well that I feel it is the duty of the Disciples of Christ to continue in the office for another year.

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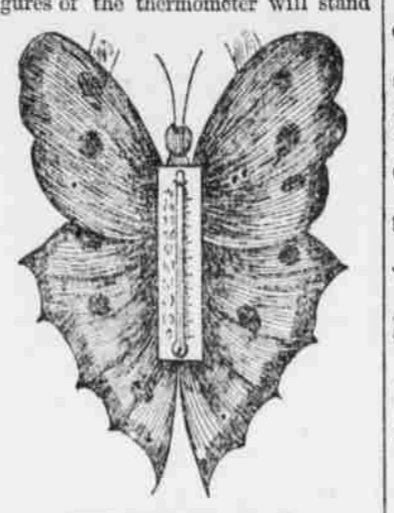
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A USEFUL ORNAMENT. This is a handsome ornament for any room and one that it is not difficult to make if the reader will only follow these directions...
