ATHORN FOR THE SCHOOL BOARD.

Increased Building Appropriations Worries the Members.

Controller F. L. Wormser yesterday discussed with a TRIBUNE reporter his opposition to awarding the contract for building No. 27 school at a cost of \$9,000 in excess of the appropriation. He said:

"I am opposed to such a policy for several reasons: it establishes a bad precedent and consumes money which could be more judiciously applied. If, as some of the board's members state, we cannot pay teachers larger salaries, I take issue with them if money is expended on increased building appropriations.

"Because I believe in increasing the appropriation for the new high school, it must not be inferred that my opinion is feasible. This high school building will be attended by scholars from every section of the city, will be known as one of our public buildings and, of all the municipal structures, should be one of the most substantial and beautiful.
