John A. James Buried. A large number attended the funeral of the late John A. James, who died on Monday, from the home of his sister, Mrs. Williams, on North Filmore avenue.

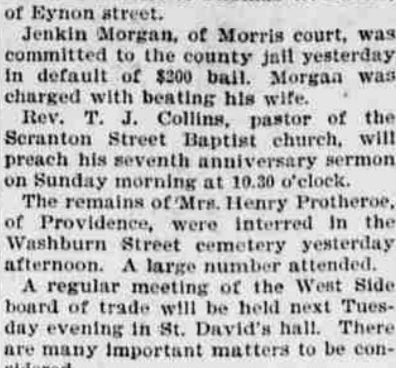

COMMITTEES WERE NAMED

Chairman Westpfahl of Select Council Makes General Change.

BIDS FORSEWER CONSTRUCTION

Thirteen Contractors Applying for the Job on the Fifth District Main Sewer. Ordinance for Paving Penn Avenue Passes Two Readings.

Select council's first regular business session of the current fiscal year was presided over last night by the new chairman, Charles Westpfahl, and the easy and natural grace exhibited in his adaptability to business promises to win a record at the conclusion of his term for fairness, enterprise and dispatch.

As soon as the minutes of the meeting of organization were read and approved, the list of standing committees was handed to City Clerk Lavelle and read. There has been a general change made in the composition of the committees. Chairman Westpfahl has made unusually good selections in his appointment of the chairmanships of the important committees. For instance, Charles P. Wagner, chief clerk in the county commissioners office, received the chairmanship of the estimates committee; Colonel George Sanderson, the chairmanship of the building committee, and Fred Durr, that of the fire department committee.

Colonel Sanderson is the only member, it will be noticed, who has been appointed to the chairmanship of two committees. There are twenty-two committees on each member of the council has received a chairmanship. The list is as follows:

In the rear of the council chamber were a number of sewer contractors interested in the bids that were presented for the construction of Section A, of the Fifth district sewer. City Clerk Lavelle opened and read the following bids, accompanied by the requisite certified check: T. J. Jennings, \$1.87 per lineal foot; R. C. Mitchell, \$1.92 per lineal foot; A. H. Coon & Son, Kingston, Pa., \$1.85 per lineal foot; Egan & Ruddy, \$1.85 per lineal foot; Flannery & O'Hara, \$1.90 per lineal foot; Howell Bros. & Co., \$1.97 per lineal foot; J. B. Fish, \$2.43 per lineal foot; Joseph Stewart & Co., \$1.83 per lineal foot; P. J. Cleary, \$1.74 per lineal foot; Fred Hendler, \$1.64 per lineal foot; Vincent O'Hara, \$3.38 per lineal foot; Dunn Brothers, \$2.08 per lineal foot; Fahey Brothers, \$1.85 per lineal foot. Mr. Roche's motion was carried, which ordered the bids to be referred to the proper committee, with instructions to award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder, and include in his report a resolution ordering the ordinance printed.

The following appointments submitted by the mayor were confirmed: M. J. May, as permanent man of the Eagle Hose company; John Mack, as permanent man of the Neptunes, and James Hopkins, as permanent man at the Cumberland Hose house. Victor Lauer wanted to refer the nominations to committee but it was not done.

Pavement for Penn Avenue. The first ordinance to pass two readings was one to provide for the paving of Penn avenue, between Lackawanna avenue and Spruce street, with the provision that the city pay half the assessment. Mr. Finn objected vigorously, but his opposition to the ordinance was not effective. Ordinances providing for grading and constructing the approaches to the Spruce street and Roaring Brook bridges were introduced by Mr. Roche. Resolutions passed were: Directing the city engineer to make the assessment for paving Clay avenue from the termination of the asphalt pavement at Oliver street, to the south side of Pine street; authorizing the chief engineer to issue five orders for Lumber and Twenty-second streets; authorizing the city engineer to make a plan or profile of grade of Twenty-second street, from Luzerne northerly six hundred feet.

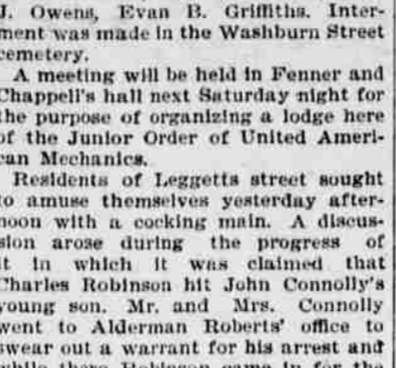
