CONFIRMATION OF BOYS. Sacramento Imparted to Them by Rt. Rev. Bishop O'Hara. HIS REMARKS TO THE CHILDREN.

There were Two Hundred and Fifty of Them and They Marched in Two to the Altar, Where They Were Confirmed by the Venerable Bishop.

At St. Peter's cathedral yesterday afternoon Rt. Rev. Bishop O'Hara officiated in the administration of the sacrament of confirmation upon more than 250 young boys.

Under the guidance of the sisters of St. Cecilia's convent, the young soldiers of Christ were martyred and aligned in Colgate hall. Each boy was dressed in holiday attire and at 2:45 they marched to the church and took seats in the center aisle.

It was precisely 3 o'clock when the bishop and attendant priests appeared from the sacristy. The girls of the Angel's sodality sang in concert the hymn, "Veni Creator Spiritus," when the bishop ascended the altar and took his seat on the sedalia.

Remarks by the Bishop. After the hymn the children were spoken to in a kind paternal spirit by the bishop. He told them that their souls had been cleansed by the sacrament of baptism, which made Catholics of them.

The venerable bishop has been slightly indisposed for the past few days and the strain of confirming this large class of boys was feared to be too much for him, but he was resolute and would not forego the pleasure it gives him to perform the duties of his office.

Confirmed on the Altar Steps. To lighten the labor the children marched in two through the sanctuary rail, up the steps of the altar, and knelt before the bishop seated on his throne.

While the boys were marching forward the choir sang the Act of Contrition. At the altar, before the bishop, stood Mr. and Mrs. T. Leonard, acting as sponsors for the young soldiers of the Lord.
