APPORTIONMENT IS KILLED

Congressional, Senatorial and Legislative Measures Collapse.

KILLED BY ORDER OF MR. QUAY

The Complexion of Philadelphia Makes It Imperative That It Shall Not Be Allowed More Power Until After the National Convention.

Special to the Scranton Tribune. Harrisburg, May 21.—There will be no apportionment by this legislature. This was made clear today by the defeat on final passage of all measures of this character. The congressional, senatorial and legislative measures were killed by the order of Mr. Quay.

Only one reason is assigned for the defeat of these measures. It is that under the new apportionment Philadelphia would be entitled to another congressman. This means more money to be sent to the city.
