Johnson's Steady Pitching and Real Live Fielding Wins from the Ponies One of the Most Exciting and Evenly Contested Games of the Season. Yesterday he received excellent support by all the Scranton players, five of whom were playing in comparatively new positions owing to Whitehead's release and Ward's sprained ankle.
