

NEWS OF OUR INDUSTRIES. Hoppenings of Interest to the Stapel Trades and Particularly to the Trade in Iron, Steel and Anthrnelte Coal.

Another advance in the price of anthracke coal will be made on Oct. 24. This change will aply only to tidewater points, but in all probability another advance will be made to the city and line trade on Nov. 1. There is hardly any doubt but that the coal dealers are geting anxious in regard to their stock of coal, and besides, as the price is rapidly going up, they are doing all they can to secure a large amount before another advance is mads. During the summer menths, when anthracite coal was selling at a low figure there was considerable coal laid in by the dealers, but during the last few weeks the demand has been so great that the stock has been used up and they are importuning the coal companies to deliver coal to them as speedily as possible. Beside this there is a shortage in domestic prepared sizes, and the coal companies cannot begin to fill their orders for stove and egg sizes of coal. The Beadling company has been short of

in domestic prepared sizes, and the coal companies cannot begin to fill their orders for stove and egg sizes of oad. The Reading company has been short of these two sizes for some time, and notwithstanding this company has increased its tomage there is not enough of these sizes on hand to meet all the requirements. At New York there has been a big demand for egg and stove for a number of weeks, but owing to the scarcity the demand could not be accommic lated. The new circular which is set to go into effect Oct. 24 is as follows: Broken, \$2.75; egg. \$2.90; stove, \$4.15 and chestnut, \$2.90. These prices apply to New York tide water points, f. o. b. At the same time there will also be issued a circular relative to coal at tide in Publishelbia. The circular will be 25 cents a ton less than the ceal is sold for in New York. On Nov. 1, in all probability, there will be another advance in the price of authractic coal to the city and line trade. 
