SEVEN MORE FAILURES

That Number of Divorces Were Granted Yesterday.

REASONS FOR THE DECREES

Sad Tales of Domestic Tribulations Contained in the Papers in the Cases.

In seven cases where marriage has been a failure, the court yesterday granted divorces. Charles A. Cobb was unfettered from his wife, Angie H. Cobb. They were married Oct. 28, 1886, at Binghamton by Rev. Manley S. Hard, D. D., and lived together happily and contented until Feb. 15, 1893. Then she packed her trunk and left him. All efforts at reconciliation were idle. Cobb now resides in Benson, and his former wife resides at Green Grove. Adary A. Radeker, whose maiden name was Mary Harbom, was divorced from George B. Radeker. They were joined in wedlock on Aug. 15, 1890, at Newport, Kings county, N. Y., and lived together until July 1, 1895. They resided in this city at 1171 Monsey avenue. It was proved by two witnesses that Radeker was faithless to his wife and abused her. Arnie Kelleman was separated from Frederick Kelleman. They were married in 1887 by Alderman Rosier, then of the Eighth ward of this city, and lived together until five months ago. Arnie Kelleman was separated from her husband on several occasions. He would not work, would come home drunk and would choke her. On one occasion he took an axe, and, but for she escaped to a neighbor's house, might have killed her. They lived near No. 7 school house, in the Twentieth ward.

Mrs. Susan Gardner, Over 80 Years Old, Dies in Scott Township.

One of the last of the early settlers in this region to die was Mrs. Susan Gardner, who passed away in Scott township Thursday.
