#### NEWS OF OUR INDUSTRIES.

It is said that plans are being talked about for the construction of a railroad cabout for the construction of a railroad cat the west side of the Susquehanna rivers to parallel the Lehigh Valley's tracks, the new line to reach Buffalo. The story goes that the New York, Susquehanna and Western people are behind the deal.

"We are informed," says the Engi-peering and Mining Journal, "that the Anthracite Coal Operators' association is taking active steps to secure repre-sentation on the boards of directors of the various railroad companies which carry the coal of its members. A proxy committee has been appointed to solicit proxies from the stockholders A considerable amount of the stocks is already held by members of the association, and it looks as if they would be successful. Such an event would be of considerable benefit to the stock-holders of many of the 'coalers' as certain parties. tain unwise actions to which we have been treated in the past will become more difficult when among the directors more difficult when among the directors there is someone who can ask intelligent questions about the coal policy of the road. The benefits that will accrue from this will not be one-side!. To the flippant assertion that the independent operators are looking out for their own interests it need only be pointed out that the prosperity of the railroad company is that of the operator. For the latter to get a high price for his coal means that the carrier is getting a correspondingly high freight, since the rate is 40 per cent, of the tidewater selling price. It is to be hoped that the association may succeed in its enassociation may succeed in its endeavors."

#### RAILROAD NOTES.

The Reading reorganization plan will be issued soon. Its terms have by no means been definitely agreed on. There may be material changes in the present draft. It will be necessary to raise about \$25,000,000. No underwriting syndicate has yet been formed, but that will be an easy task. The syndicate will be partly made up in London. Wall street talk is that the assessment will be 25 per cent, on the stock, 10 per cent. on the first preference income bonds, 12 per cent, on the second incomes, and 15 per cent, on the third incomes. According to reports the income bonds will be converted into preferred stock.

The sale of the Locokport and Buffalo railroad to the Eric reorganization committee has been consummated. The stock of \$127,000 was purchased at par, the purchasers to assume a bonded in-debtedness of \$140,000.

Not only is it true, as stated in dis-patches Saturday, that John D. Rocke-feller is interested in the reorganization of the Wisconsin Central, but it is learned on good authority that he has be-tween \$3,000,000 and \$3,500,000 invested in the securities of that company.

The Farmers' loan and trust com pany, as trustee under the several Northern Pacific mortgages in default, has come to the conclusion that its president should appeal in person to the several Western United States judges to agree upon such a policy as regards the question of jurisdiction and the per-sonnel of the receivers as will again as-sure a competent, uniform economical maragement of the imperiled railroad system in the interest of its mortgage credbors. President Rolston will start on that mission Wednesday.






