1895 as in the year preceding, and more than a third larger than the imports during 1892. The imports last year amounted to 322,199 tons, compared with 59,955 tons in 1891, and 291,707 tons in 1892. Owing to the widespread depression in the iron industry and the illness of the great works of the Maryland Steel company, at Sparrow's Point, Md., some of the largest consumers of foreign iron ore—the imports in 1894 were the smallest in the last quarter century. In 1894, the year of heaviest importations of iron ore, the imports amounted to 104,698 tons, or 211 tons more than the imports during the whole of 1891, and from July 1 to Dec. 31, 1895, the imports aggregated 217,522 tons, or more than double the receipts during the first six months of the year. Of the 282,877 tons of iron ore imported last year, 282,877 tons or more than two-thirds of the total quantity imported from the two lines of two American companies, The Juniata Iron company, limited, a Philadelphia corporation, and the Pennsylvania Steel company, shipped 311,000 tons from Santiago de Cuba. The remainder was from other sources, a New York corporation in which Standard Oil capitalists are chief interests shipped 12,121 tons from Baltimore Bay on the southern coast of Cuba.

INDUSTRIAL.

Philadelphia Record: On account of the tremendous activity in the iron industry during the last half of 1895 there was a marked revival in the import trade in iron ore. Practically all of this business now centers in Philadelphia and Baltimore, and figures compiled from the custom house records and obtained from ore importers show that the imports at these two ports last year amounted to 282,877 gross tons. The total imports in 1894 were only 104,698 tons, the lowest point reached in many years. The year of greatest activity in this trade was 1890, when the imports reached a tonnage of 1,200,000 gross tons. Imports of iron ore at this port were more than three times as large in
