Washington, April 27.—Consideration of the pension bill, after three days' discussion, was concluded in the house of representatives today and a vote upon its passage will be taken tomorrow.

The hour and a half discussion resulted in the adoption of just one amendment to the first section, offered by Mr. Hendon, providing for a fiscal construction of the law.
