ALDERMAN WRIGHT OBJECTS.

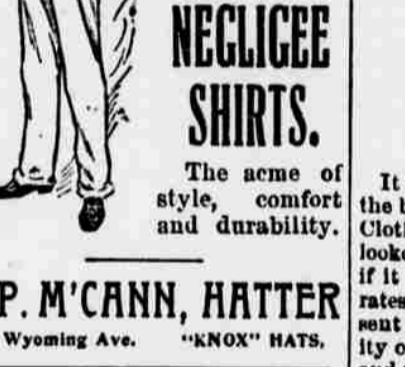
