MONEY DISTRIBUTED.

Only One of MacKnight's Creditors Able to Realize--Employees First. Court made the following order yesterday in the case of E. A. Hancock vs. O. E. MacKnight: "Now, June 3, two return days having passed since the issue of the above writs and no order having been asked for to pay money into court, the sheriff is hereby directed to distribute the fund in his hands according to priority of execution, and wage claims are ordered to be paid out."

Sheriff Martin, who had \$1,157 which the proceeds of all the sales of the property and estate, went to Plains today and paid to the clerks and employees of the store all the wages and money due them. The balance will go to E. A. Hancock, who held the first lien or judgment against MacKnight. The amount he will receive will not be more than one-third the amount of this note, which was \$3,000. All of the other creditors of the bankrupt merchant are much worse off, for they will be unable to get a cent, there being no more money or other property to levy on.

DARING BURGLARS.

Get Away With a Lot of Money, Jewelry and Gold Watches. Tuesday evening on South Franklin street occurred one of the most daring burglaries one can imagine. In broad daylight between 2 and 5 o'clock, the house of John H. McLean at 233 was entered in his absence, and two gold watches and \$100 in money taken. Mr. McLean left the house at 2 in the afternoon, and the burglar was not known until his son turned from school. The burglar entered by a cellar window, and going upstairs ransacked every bureau drawer.

Not content here, the same party went into the house next door, 231, occupied by E. D. Frazer. Mrs. Frazer had gone out to do some shopping and her return found that \$70 in money, some jewelry and gold watches were taken. The thieves made good their escape and even the time honored and useful clue was not left by this bold party.

STRIKE AT WOODWARD.

The Miners Refuse to Remove Rock for Nothing. The miners and laborers to the number of 125 employed at the Woodward mine on the west side of the river went out on strike yesterday, which was caused by a reduction of \$1.50 a yard on the rock work done on the three foot rock vein. Under the new order they claim that they are virtually obliged to move the rock for little or nothing and cannot make enough wages to live on.
