Weighty Question Debated in the Howard Place A. M. E. Annex.

A debate on the financial topic involved in the recent presidential campaign took place last night in the annex of the Howard Place African Methodist Episcopal church. Postmaster Crump presided over the debates. The judges were G. W. Brown, James Foster and Louis Morton. While the judges were deliberating over their decision there was an address made on the tariff by Alamanza Porter. It was an argument in support of protection principles.

The audience was largely composed of colored women, but the men present quite generally represented the thinking and industrious colored citizen element of the city. Their sympathies were evidently with the gold standard.

CANT FISH THERE NOW.

Decree of the Court Regarding Thompson and Others.

In an equity case of the Crystal Lake Water company against John C. Thompson, George Ross, Jr., and William Price, Judge Archibald yesterday handed down a decree restraining the defendants from fishing in a dam owned by the Crystal company. The decree is as follows:

"And now, August 12, in accordance with agreement of plaintiff and defendant and after full hearing, it is ordered, adjucged and decreed that the defendants, John C. Thompson, George Ross, Jr., and William Price, do perpetually enjoin and restrain from trespassing upon the land, water and air above or below the Crystal Lake Water company's dam and from fishing in and about same, and from having anything whatever to do with the same."

The agreement filed between the plaintiff and the defendants is to the effect that a judgment pro confesso be entered to the bill of complaint in favor of the Crystal Lake Water company and against the defendants, and it is also agreed that the rate of defendants to show cause why a preliminary injunction, as prayed for, shall be granted.
