M'KINLEY'S STAR GROWS BRIGHTER

His Success at the Coming Election Now Seems Assured.

THE CAMPAIGN IN NEW YORK

Preparations for a Mass Meeting in Carnegie Hall--Cheering News Comes from the South--Major McKinley's Letter of Acceptance is Finished.

New York, Aug. 20.--The big Republican mass meeting to be held in Carnegie Music hall, at which ex-President Harrison will be the chief orator is now attracting the attention of Chairman Mark Hanna and the members of the Republican national committee.

His opinion is that it will be a great event, and produce a salutary effect similar to the Bourke Cockran meeting in Madison square Garden.

The speech that will be delivered by Mr. Harrison will be sent broadcast throughout the country and especially to the state of Indiana, where there are about 7,000 floating voters.

Mr. Hanna arrived at headquarters at 10 o'clock, and when questioned about the solid South he said he hoped to carry several states. He declined to go into particulars.

Mr. Hanna is more enthusiastic than any Southern Republican. His enthusiasm and energy are contagious.

CHERRING WORDS FROM SOUTH. Maryland is also another state that is doubtful and leaning toward Republicanism.

General T. Michener of Indiana, Congressman R. W. Taylor of Ohio, and W. D. Babcock, chairman of the Republican national congressional committee, called on Mr. Hanna today at headquarters.
