PEOPLE'S PARTY WAIL.

Chairman Washburn Makes a Statement Regarding the Situation Viewed from His Standpoint.

Chicago, Nov. 4.—The following statement of the presidential situation was issued tonight by Chairman Washburn, of the Chicago headquarters, People's Party committee:

The people through fear of a repetition of the Tilden episode. We have positive evidence that the Republican national committee has hired their state committees to claim certain votes which are in doubt. We shall vigorously press the question, viz: If it is not for the purpose of manipulating them, why are they held back? We want the American people to be patient and calm and to wait for the official returns and pay no attention to the false reports sent out by manipulating committees.

The will of the people will never again be defeated through the manipulation of returns. It is our duty to the presidency. The political crime of 1876 will be repeated if repeated.

The returns this evening indicate that Mr. Bryan will carry all of the states west of the Missouri and south of the Potomac, which include Maryland and Delaware, making 23 electoral votes. Delaware is still in doubt, but are sure of one elector, which makes 24. Added to the Michigan's 11 votes or Indiana's 12 votes and it insures Bryan's election.

The returns from both of these states show positive gains for Bryan in all of the suburban districts.

It is thought that McKinley's Election Will Stimulate Trade.

London, Nov. 4.—Liverpool commercial and shipping circles are well satisfied with the result of the presidential election in America. In Glasgow mercantile circles it is believed that the result of the election will stimulate exports to the United States and there is a desire to rush export trade as much

as possible before McKinley takes his seat, the general expectation being that a high tariff of at least 2 cents will be imposed upon sugar.

No doubt is entertained that there would be a rush in the woolen and soft goods markets or that the iron and steel trade will be so busy that the delivery of goods before March 1897, will be virtually impossible.

OUR THANKSGIVING. The Last Proclamation Issued by President Grover Cleveland.

By the President of the United States: The people of the United States should never be unmindful of the gratitude they owe the God of nations for his watchful care which shielded them from dire disaster and pointed out to them a way of peace and happiness. Nor should they ever refuse to acknowledge with contrite hearts their proneness to turn away from God's teachings, and to follow with sinful pride after their own devices.

To the end that these thoughts may be quickened, it is fitting that on a day especially appointed, we should join together in approaching the throne of grace with praises and supplication. Therefore, I, Grover Cleveland, president of the United States, do hereby designate and set apart Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of the present month of November to be kept and observed as a day of thanksgiving, do hereby throughout our land.

On that day let our people forego their usual work and occupation, and assemble in their accustomed places of worship, let them with one accord thanksgiving, the poor and needy, and by deeds of charity let our offerings of praise be made more acceptable in the sight of the Lord.

Witness my hand and the seal of the United States, which I have caused to be hereunto affixed.
