AN UNPRECEDENTED BUSINESS BOOM. Nearly 400 Establishments Have Started Up Since Election. INCREASE IN TRADE EVERYWHERE.

New York, Nov. 20.—R. G. Dun & Co. will say tomorrow in their weekly review of trade conditions that the gain in volume of business continues entirely without precedent. More than 390 establishments have started work since the election, which were idle and only expected to be increased working forces.
