WHOLESALE POISONING.

Milwaukee Families Are Ill After Eating Products from a Bakery.

Milwaukee, Wis., Dec. 4.—The health department reports a wholesale poisoning of families in the northern part of the city. According to reports which reach the health department, members of about 100 families are ill with the symptoms of arsenical poisoning. Among those who are reported to be ill are the families of Mr. Taft, a reporter on the Herald; Mr. Herzberg, 325 Fourth street; Mr. Wise, a butcher, and a family at 618 Clark street.

The people who are sick had eaten bread purchased at a bakery establishment on Sherman street, and the physicians and officers of the health department are inclined to attribute the origin of the wholesale poisoning poisoning to that source.

SHOT REV. LONDON SHEARS.

Officer Curry Kills a Colored Man Who Resisted Arrest.

Washington, Dec. 4.—Police Officer Edward Curry shot and killed London Shears, colored, this afternoon. Shears was resisting the officer and beating him with his own baton, when the fatal shot was fired.

The dead man called himself the "Rev." London Shears, and was a well known character in South Washington, where he preached occasionally about the streets. His pious calling did not prevent him from being well known to the police, and he has been arrested a number of times on various charges. He was discharged from jail a few days ago, where he had served a sentence for committing an assault. The police said he was badly hurt by the man he killed.
