THE ELECTORAL VOTE.
No Change in the Count as Heretofore.
Published—Proceedings Witnessed by Large Crowd of Spectators.
Washington, Feb. 10.—The house joined today with the senate in witnessing the count of the electoral vote for president and vice president of the United States for the term beginning March 4, 1897, and after the announcement of the result adjourned until tomorrow. There was no change in the vote from that expected after the popular election in November had expressed the people's will, and consequently no surprises. The votes of the several states were read in turn by the tellers—Senators Lodge, of Massachusetts, and Blackburn, of Kentucky, and Representatives Grosvener, of Ohio, and Richardson, of Tennessee.
