Turkish Garrison at Kisamo Asks Assistance---A Social Reformer and Six Nurses Start for the Island.

Canca, Crete, April 7 .- The insurgents of the vicinity of Kisamo, at the western end of the island, have written to the foreign admirals giving notice that they are projecting an attack upon the fort at Kisamo. The Turkish garrison there hun asked for assistance. Two thousand insurgents have crowded around Sitia, at the eastern end of the island, and a French warship has land-ed five guns in anticipation of an attack ipon that place. Canea, Crete, April 7.-Brisk fighting took place today outside of Candia. The insurgents in considerable strength ad-vanced from four points and attacked the Turkish outposts. 


