ABLE ADDRESS ON ABRAHAM LINCOLN

Delivered by T. Thomas Fortune in Penn Avenue Baptist Church. WAS FOR A VERY WORTHY OBJECT

It is the intention to erect in This City a Monument to the Martyred President and Mr. Fortune Came Here to Start the Movement--Paid an Eloquent Tribute to the Great Friend of the Colored Man.

"Abraham Lincoln" was the subject of an address given last evening in the Penn Avenue Baptist church by T. Thomas Fortune, a colored man.

BEFORE THE LECTURE. Almazana Porter was chairman of the evening. Miss Freeman played a very fine piano selection and Rev. Joseph K. Dixon then offered a prayer spoken in the spirit of the occasion.

AFTER HIS ELECTION. Continuing and speaking of the dark days after Lincoln's election, Mr. Fortune said: "Clouds hung heavy over the land. Mr. Lincoln's journey to Washington was full of sadness, although the people gave him enthusiastic welcome all along the route.

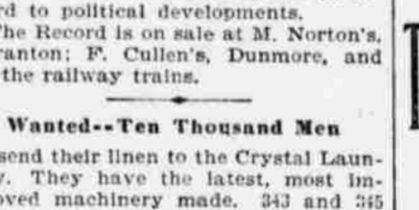
