SNYDER HAD A MOST MARVELOUS ESCAPE

Fainted and Fell from the Top of a Box Car. HE LANDED ON THE BUMPER

Unconscious and Lying Face Down, with His Body Stretched Across the Bumpers, He Rode from La Plume to Clark's Summit, Where He Was Found by His Fellow Workmen. Was Not Very Badly Injured.

His train left Nicholson shortly after noon and he went out on the middle section. He was seen at La Plume by one of his fellow employes but no one remembers having seen notice of him again until Clark's Summit was reached.

When the train stopped there and he did not show up to help in the switching the crew became alarmed for his safety and sent a going out train examining the wheels to see if there was any evidence of his having been run over.
