

CLIFF KNORR'S CHARACTER

Voluminous Evidence Produced to Prove Him a Bad Man.

NEEDED NO INSTRUCTOR Witnesses Testify That Knorr Has Always Been Vicious.

T. F. Hayman Alleges That Wintersteen Slept in His House on the Night That Knorr Had Located Him Elsewhere--Mrs. Hayman Gives Strange Evidence--Numerous Character Witnesses Are Sworn in Wintersteen's Behalf.

Bloomsburg, Pa., June 3--While nothing of a sensational character developed at today's session of the Wintersteen dynamite trial, voluminous evidence was adduced by the defense, the trend of which was to blacken Knorr's character and relieve Wintersteen's odium.

HAYMAN'S TESTIMONY. T. F. Hayman, a friend and client of Wintersteen and a resident of Reading, testified that Wintersteen came to Reading on July 27 to transact business with him and slept at his house that night.

KNORR'S REPUTATION. Daniel Weber, of Reading, testified that Knorr's reputation was bad and that he would not believe him under oath.
