SCRANTON PLAYERS' AVERAGES.

On July 6 The Tribune published the batting and fielding averages of the Scranton club up to and including that date. Since then there have been three games with Toronto and one with Wilkes-Barre. During the week Walters showed the greatest improvement in hitting. He increased his average .025 per cent and advanced from seventh to fourth place on the team. Bonter increased .019 per cent, Wellner and Beard, .008 per cent. Meany fell off .022 per cent, from first place to sixth. Boyd lost .005 per cent. Massey, .005 per cent. Gunson and Maguire, .002 per cent, each and O'Brien the insignificant amount of .001 per cent. Egan has not played since the figures were last published and so his averages remain unchanged. The club's fielding record continues to be remarkably good. The lowest average is the .919 of Maguire. His percentage is high for the position he occupies and was exceeded last year by only four third-basemen. Two of these were Lewee and Harrington who played in but 19 and 16 games respectively. Altogether the figures are better than those possessed by any club in the Eastern, the batting and fielding averages considered jointly, and it is quite likely that no club in the league excels the Miners in hitting.
