

BUSINESS MEN ARE FOR TRACY

They Are Impressed with the Gravity of the Situation.

ITS NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

New York Must Remain Republican.

Believed to Represent the President's Sentiments--Talk of Reviving the Sound Money League--The Principles of 1896 at Stake.

New York, Oct. 14.--The principal political events of the day were the acceptance of the nomination for controller by the Henry George ticket, Mayor Street's first speech for Seth Low, in which he resented the interference of the national administration in the Greater New York campaign, and Tammany Hall's ratification meeting, which was neither so well attended nor so enthusiastic as the leaders had hoped. The Citizens' union is holding numerous meetings, and Henry George is about to take the stump.

EFFECT OF BLISS' LETTER.

The letter of Cornelius N. Bliss to General Tracy has given a fresh impetus to the campaign. It has had a stirring effect among business men, irrespective of party. Mr. Bliss' utterances have impressed them seriously. As a member of President McKinley's cabinet he has had an extended opportunity to observe and gauge the political sentiment of the country, and he declares that the contest of 1896 has been the most important in the history of the nation, and that the safety of the national government, based on a sound financial system, is as much an issue now as it was then. A profound impression has been created in the minds of business men by those words in Mr. Bliss' letter.

PRINTERS ON A STRIKE.

Buffalo, N. Y., Oct. 14.--The hand compositors in the different newspaper offices in this city recently presented a new scale of wages in the form of a circular which will increase the wages paid to these men about one dollar a day. Conference has been held without result for several days. The owners of the papers refused to grant the increase, and all of the hands employed in the composing room walked out. The Express will appear as usual in the morning, the management says. What action is to be taken by the evening papers is not yet known. The Court-Record management promises to grant the increase and their men are at work.

REFLECTS MCKINLEY'S VIEWS.

Secretary Bliss' opinion carries much weight because it is known that he would have had the nomination for mayor, and the natural conclusion is that if he had been a candidate he would have made the race on the issues which he thinks are paramount in this campaign, as a Republican who shall declare and stand by Republican principles and policies, whether in municipal or state affairs.

WHAT THE NEWSPAPERS SAY

Extracts from the London Journals.

London, Oct. 14.--The Daily News commenting on the proposed sealing conference, says: "It is probable that a settlement may be arrived at by compensating the Canadian sealers in a lump sum for abandonment of their rights under the 1892 treaty. There is reason to believe that Washington is not indisposed to entertain this. Once this principle is admitted it is not likely that there would be any difficulty in fixing the amount of compensation; and if this vested interest were cleared away there would be no difficulty in arranging with the United States for say five years close time on both land and sea.

BIMETALLISM IN ENGLAND.
