TRIED ON THE CHARGE OF EMBEZZLEMENT

Case of Tax Collector T. E. Boland, of Dunmore, is Now On.

WHAT THE DEFENSE WILL SHOW

Allegation is that Mr. Boland Turned in Taxpayers on the Exonerated List from Whom He Had Collected Taxes—Nearly All Day Taken up with the Hearing of Testimony for the Prosecution—Various Cases of Minor Importance Disposed Of.

The case of ex-Tax Collector T. E. Boland, of Dunmore, charged by Jeremiah McPeck with the embezzlement of \$1,500 of the county's funds, was called for trial before Judge Edwards, in court room No. 2 yesterday morning.

The opening of the defense was made by Mr. Kelly just before adjournment. He said that he proposed to prove that Mr. Boland did not embezzle even the \$15, to which amount the "31,500 or upwards" of the indictment has dwindled.

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BOGART BURGLARS WILL BE TRIED HERE

New Developments in the Big Jewelry Robbery Were Interesting.

EVERYTHING PROBABLY RECOVERED

List from the Chicago Police Captains Descriptions of Articles Which Compare with the Stolen Property. Desk Sergeant Deiter Will Leave This Morning for Harrisburg to Get the Necessary Requisition Papers. How the Arrest Was Worked.

The Bogart burglary, without a doubt the nearest approach to the real thing ever accomplished hereabouts, will result in the prosecution in this city of the three widely-known professional crooks, who were arrested in Chicago Friday, and the facts furthermore tend to show that it was from a local source that the capture was directed and brought about.

Yesterday the developments were rapid and decisive. First came the intelligence that Garrett Bogart and Detective Moir had arrived in Chicago; immediately after this came the information that the property recovered had been identified; the morning mail brought a list of the booty recovered; the description tallied with the jewelry taken from the Bogart home, and finally Desk Sergeant Robert A. Deiter was ordered to secure requisition papers from Harrisburg and proceed at once to Chicago.

The description of the property recovered was addressed to Chief of Police Frank Robling. NEARLY ALL RECOVERED. In the list of the goods are fifty-six separate articles, all jewelry with the exception of pieces of money.

Bogart jewelry: One gent's 4 1/2 carat diamond ring; value, \$150. One lady's ring, diamond cluster, 30 stones; value, \$225. One breast pin, seven diamond pendants; value, \$105.

One gent's gold watch, hunting case; value, \$25. One lady's crescent diamond ring, nine stones; value, \$100. One gent's gold ring, turquoise stone, 10 diamonds; value, \$125.
