THREE HURT IN A RIOT.
Marching Steel Workers Hated by a Stone Thrower.
Scottish, Pa., Nov. 3.—Henry Gillespie, John Jordan and Manager Skimp, of the Scottish Iron and Steel Company, were badly injured last night in a riot, which occurred when about 40 of the employees, after quitting work, were marching up Pittsburg street in a body. The plan was to march to the home of the workers, as the Union had vowed vengeance for an assault, on Sunday, on Frank Keltz, by non-union men.

PAID TO DESTROY A FAMILY.
Pittsburg, Pa., Nov. 3.—William E. Brown, a colored lad of 15 years, having confessed that he tried to burn the house of O. R. Cook, with whom he lived, and attempted to poison the family, has been committed to jail. Mr. Cook took the boy from the Washington county almshouse and intended to educate him. The lad's excuse for his two attempts to destroy the family is the fact that he was not allowed to go out and play with other boys at night.
