

MEETING OF THE TRADES LEAGUE

Hon. Lyman Gage the Principal Speaker at Philadelphia. THE SECRETARY TALKS ON FINANCE

Philadelphia, Jan. 25.—The seventh annual meeting of the League of the Philadelphia was held tonight in the Academy of Music, at which the principal speaker was Hon. Lyman J. Gage, secretary of the treasury.

There are two opinions on the money question now, more or less firmly held by those who entertain them. One opinion is that the present gold standard should be maintained.

The statement that wages have been reduced, the speaker said, is not sustained by the commissioner of labor to show that within the period of 1872 to 1931, while prices of commodities have fallen 27 1/2 per cent, wages have increased an average of ten per cent.

REFERS TO BRYAN. Referring to a recent speech of William J. Bryan, in which the latter said "the daily papers have items of news arranged under two heads—the formation of trusts and the reduction of wages," the secretary said Mr. Bryan cited no examples of trusts, but referred to one industry in New England in which by reason of special conditions a reduction in the wage scale was under debate.

Benton, the leader of the Democratic party in 1834, had introduced a bill in the senate which was passed and which restored gold to our currency system and made it the monetary standard.
