The Pennsylvania, The Philadelphia and Reading, and the Lehigh Valley—A Comparison of Traffic with That of 1897.

Philadelphia, Sept. 29.—The statement of comparison of earnings and expenses of the Pennsylvania Railroad company for August 1898 and for eight months ending August 31, 1898, with the same period of 1897 follows:

For eight months, gross earnings, increase, \$1,519,509; expenses, increase, \$1,395,509; net earnings, decrease, \$163,999. Lines west of Pittsburgh, for 1897—Gross earnings, increase, \$55,309; expenses, increase, \$50,699; net earnings, decrease, \$4,610.
