DIFFICULTY OF OBTAINING MEDICAL STORES IN CUBA.

Surgeon B. D. Boss Relates His Experiences—Conduct of the Hospitals at Montauk Point Praised. Testimony of Other Officers.

Amnition, Ala., Oct. 25.—Dr. R. D. Boss, surgeon of the First infantry, was the first witness called before the war investigating commission today.

Dr. Connor asked if the government could not have had the supplies taken to Santiago as promptly as the Red Cross, and Dr. Boss replied that while he had no information he thought it could have done so.
