The mine ambulance removed him to his home on Boulevard avenue, where medical help was summoned. His injuries are internal and of a serious nature.

SKETCH OF WEST SIDE CONCLAVE OF HEPTASOPHS.

On this side, among the many other fraternal and beneficial orders, no lodge is more powerful or more carefully managed than West Side Conclave, No. 211, Improved Order Heptasophs, organized here in Mearns' hall, December 11, 1891, this conclave has grown to be a power even among the older organized lodges.
