TOWNSHIP CITIZENS ARE UP IN ARMS

INDIGNATION MEETING HELD IN MOOSIC LAST NIGHT.

Taxpayers of Lackawanna Township Propose to Prosecute Officials for Misconduct of the Affairs of the Municipality—Some of the Circumstances Which Give Rise to the Suspicion That There Has Been Wrong Doing—Startling Story of Misappropriation of Public Funds.

Only fourteen taxpayers of Lackawanna township responded to the call for an indignation meeting, at Raymond's hall, Moosic, last night, to protest against the manner in which the affairs of the township are being administered, but these fourteen brought along with them indignation enough to supply a dozen meetings, ten times as large.
