

NEWS OF THE GREAT INDUSTRIAL WORLD

INCREASE OF WAGES IN A NUMBER OF PLACES.

Shows That the Wave of Prosperity Which is Sweeping Over the Land is Being Felt—Capacity of the Shoe Factory at Lestershire is to be Increased One-Third—Weatherly Silk Mill is to Run a Double Turn—Some Railroad Jottings.

If any person doubts that there is at least a wave of prosperity, the following announcements of wage increase may remove that doubt.

The Williamsport Iron and Nail company, whose large plant is located in South Williamsport, have advanced the pay of their employes an average of ten per cent. The advance was entirely unprovoked by the employes, and came to them as a pleasant surprise.

The company is a stable industry and employs a large number of men. It is beginning on March 12 at 10 per cent. Increase of wages goes into effect in every department of the Riverside Iron and Steel plants here. About 4,000 men are thus made happy.

Notice of a restoration of the scale of wages prevailing before January, 1898, was posted on Saturday in the Davenport and Laconia Mills, at Biddford, and in the six cotton mills at Lewiston and Auburn, Maine. Twelve thousand operatives are benefited. A similar notice was posted in the Lowell mill, at Waterbury, employing 1,400 men, and the Edwards mill, at Augusta, Maine, employing 1,200.

The Schenck Dressed Steel company, of Allentown, advanced wages in all departments on the part of the company. The advance will affect more than 5,000 men, and the strike of smelters and dressers. The employes of the Carbon Limestone Company's quarry in Lawrence county, have been granted a 10 per cent. increase in wages, raising their pay to the figure held in 1897.

The employes of the Rees-Hammond Fire Brick company, at Bellair, West-berland county, ranging from 5 to 20 per cent, to take effect April 1. The raise is voluntary on the part of the company and will affect over 250 men. The Plant and Pore Marquette lock-out at Edgington, Mich., begun by the company several months ago against 250 union freight handlers, has been settled by the State Board of Arbitration. The board decides that the offer made by the company of 15 cents per hour for the five winter months and 20 cents for the remaining seven was a fair one. Both parties to the controversy had agreed to abide by the board's decision.

Notice have been posted at Kimberly's rolling mills at Greensville, Pa., announcing an increase of ten per cent. in wages in all departments except tonnage men, whose wages are controlled by the Amalgamated Association. Twenty furnaces are in operation and more will be put on in a few days. It is reported that the new steel trust is negotiating for the plant.

The Bethlehem Iron company at Bethlehem announce a raise in wages of ten per cent, affecting the common laborers, of whom more than 500 are on the pay roll. The order goes into effect from March 6.

SHOE TRADE PROSPECTS. The immense shoe factory at Lestershire, near Binghamton, is to have its capacity increased one-third. Improvements represented in additional buildings and machinery and to cost about \$1,200,000 are to be put on in a few days.

The main building extends east and west. Last year a 50x250 foot addition was erected at the west end of the main building and it is now proposed to extend this addition north to Corlies avenue by the erection of a three story brick building. A wing 50 feet wide and 135 feet long three stories will be extended from the east of the main building to Corlies avenue. Each of these new buildings will have basements making them properly four stories high.

A 200x50 foot two-story addition will be erected at the east end of the office wing and there will be an addition one story and basement at the rear of the main building.

TO RUN NIGHT AND DAY. Orders have been posted that the weatherly silk mill will run on double turn until further notice. This order will necessitate the employment of extra hands though there are now 300 employed. An addition to the mill is to be built also. Arrangements have been made with the Lehigh Valley railroad for running special trains to and from Harrison until further notice for the operatives from that place and along the line. It is quite a novelty to see the girls departing for work on the night train.

The factory of the Coe Brass company at Torrington, Conn., is running night and day with its full force of 1,200 hands. The chief product of the company is cartridge shells, and it is understood that the rush is caused by large orders from the government and from Russia.
