SCHOOL BOARD CASE TO BE RE-ARGUED. APPARENTLY A DEADLOCK AMONG THE JUSTICES. Number of Times the Merits of This Case Has Been Discussed Before the Supreme Court—Solicitor D. J. Reedy, of the School Board, Takes the Order for a Re-Argument as a Hopeful Sign for the Board of Twenty-One—Nothing Known About the Time for Re-Argument.

THE SUPREME COURT AT PHILADELPHIA yesterday handed down an order for a re-argument of the school board case. This would seem to indicate that there is a deadlock among the judges about the case, the court having but six members since the death of Justice Williams.

IT IS NOT KNOWN AT THIS TIME when the supreme court will hear the re-argument, but in all probability it will not be before May, when the court meets at Harrisburg. When it is next argued an effort will be made to have all the cities interested in the decision submit paper books. These cities are: Pittston, Easton, Hazleton, Lebanon, Tiptonville, Meadville and Harrisburg.

THE MÉRITS OF THE MATTER under consideration have been argued before the supreme court twice in the Pittston case, once when the Scranton case came up for a general hearing and twice when the matters growing out of the writ of supersedeas were under consideration.
