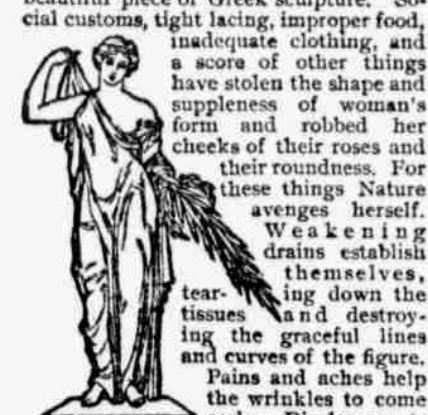
The first witness called was Thomas W. Barlow, special assistant to former District Attorney Graham, who was appointed receiver of the bank at the time of its failure.
