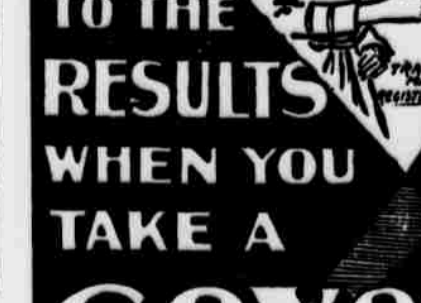

TYPHOID IN THE DELAWARE.

Trenton Will Continue to Suffer from Polluted Stream.

Trenton, N. J., Jan. 31.—Dr. Henry Mitchell, secretary of the state board of health, has submitted a report on the condition of the Delaware river water, which was analyzed at the suggestion of the Trenton board of health.

The board found that garbage is dumped into the Delaware river from sewers at Easton and that at Lambertville refuse matter is dumped along the river bank and drains into the river.

The pollution was found to be worse at Trenton than at points further up the river.
