Rails Warped by the Sun.

The Scranton Railway company are repairing their road-bed between Bull's head and Court street, preparatory to the paving operations now under way and, while the rails were exposed to the sun on Monday, several lengths were warped in such a manner that it and bowling alleys. was almost impossible to run the cars over them.

It is a peculiar fact that if the rails are exposed any length of time the sun's heat will draw them all out of shape and render them useless when charged with electricity. It is also a notable fact that the rails are seldom connected when laid if the steel is heated by the sun, as they do not remain in their proper position. The defect was remedied yesterday

and the construction work is being pushed rapidly.




