Secretary Dolph B. Atherton, of the board of trade, is sending out a copy of the following letter, personally addressed, to 1,000 small manufacturers in New York city and Brooklyn, with a view of having them leave the overcrowded metropolis and locate in this city:

Dear Sir: That profits depend more on low cost of production than on any other feature of business, is a fact recognized by all manufacturers. If you desire to produce your goods at lowest cost, it will pay you to consider the advisability of locating your plant in or near the city of Scranton, Pennsylvania.
