TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN—THE FOLLOWING ordinance is hereby adopted by the City of Scranton: That any person who shall be guilty of the violation of the same, shall be liable to pay a fine of not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars, or to be imprisoned for not more than thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the court. Section 1. Be it ordained by the Select and Council of the City of Scranton, that it is hereby ordered by the authority of the same, that from and after the passage of this ordinance any person or persons within the City of Scranton who shall keep any tipping shop, unlicensed tipping shop, or unlicensed house or place where intoxicating liquors are sold, and the licensee of any such shop, house or place, shall be liable to pay a fine of not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars, or to be imprisoned for not more than thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the court. Section 2. Be it further ordained by the Select and Council of the City of Scranton, that any person who shall be guilty of the violation of the provisions of this ordinance may be made upon the information of any person under oath, and it shall be lawful for the Mayor of the City of Scranton, or any Alderman of said City to issue warrants to arrest any person so charged, and either discharge or impose upon such person the penalty provided for in this ordinance.
