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Hopbottom, Sept. 5.-A most singular accident occurred here Tuesday morn-ing, the result of which it is feared will prove fatal.

Rev. Mrs. Homans, who had been spending the night with a sick friend was returning home at about 5 a. m., when the stone walk over which she was passing suddenly gave way, causing her to drop several feet into the water channel beneath, which extends the whole length of Main street, under the walks. The stone was 9 feet by 5 feet and from four to six inches in thickness, and as the two pieces fell into the channel she was pinioned between them in such a manner that her head was badly cut and bruised, and it is feared she may have sustained serious internal injuries as well, Two men who were on the street and heard the crash hurried to the rescue,

but were unable to remove the stones until other help arrived. The cause of the accident was due to the fact that the stone was not the fine flagging generally used about here, but was of a red shell nature, and had probably become partially disintegrated and then cracked almost by its own weight.
