INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE SOO.

It is Proposed to Erect Blast Furnaces and a Steel Plant on the Canadian Side Which Will Be Supervised by Alfred Ernst—Plans of the Man Who is at the Head of the Enterprise—Digging the Foundations for the Y. M. C. A. Building.

A dispatch from Saint Ste. Marie to the Chicago Record states some details of an interesting industrial project.

There are now being constructed on the Canadian side of the "Soo" by a company of which Francis H. Clerge is manager, a steel mill and blast furnace plant, each of 600 tons daily capacity.

The acting superintendent of construction, by the way, is Mr. Alfred Ernst, of the Wellman-Stearns Engineering company, of Cleveland, Ohio, formerly a resident of Scranton.

The proposed furnace will receive the iron from the company's mines just opened on the north shore of Lake Superior and their fuel from the lands through which its railways are now building.

Under the system of bonuses given by the Canadian government to encourage the iron and steel industry, these furnaces will receive a cash subsidy their first year of nearly \$200,000.

Two considerations have kept others from attempting such great plants. There is a dearth of forests owned by ironmakers of such size as to warrant the establishment of very large furnaces using wood as fuel.

Mr. Clerge, the Record's special correspondent, has just established at London and Liverpool immigration offices and expects to bring to the lands north of the "Soo" that have been granted his company by government, at least 2,000 men in the present year.
