SETTLEMENT OF CARPENTERS' STRIKE IN SIGHT.

Meeting Will Be Held Tonight in the Office of the Secretary of the Builders' Exchange to Discuss the Matter—Condition of the Anthracite Coal Market—Action Taken by the Building Trades Council—The D. L. & W. Board for Today. General Notes.

Present indications point to a speedy settlement of the carpenters' strike, which has been in progress for almost two years, and a meeting will tonight be held between the members of the Builders' Exchange and the strikers, at which it is hoped a mutual understanding will be arrived at.

It is expected that some of the carpenters' executive officers will arrive in the city this afternoon and will attend tonight's meeting. The strike has now been on for twenty-two months, several ineffectual efforts being made to settle it.

When it was called six hundred and twenty carpenters stopped work, but of this number only two hundred and fifty remain in Scranton, the majority having drifted to other fields, and there now being scarcely a state in the Union where there are not some members of the local lodge.

The complaints which caused the strike have now diminished down to five grievances, the demand for an eight-hour day, instead of nine as heretofore, and an increase of five cents per hour, which would give an hourly wage of thirty cents. Several meetings have been held recently between the strikers, the city and the Builders' Exchange. Tonight's session will be held in the office of Secretary B. P. Ludwig, of the exchange.

Action of Building Trades Council.

The press committee of the Building Trades Council, which consists of Hugh Payne, E. Sabatini, A. C. Brown, N. P. Gibson and M. Staff. The resolution follows:

At a regular meeting of the Building Trades Council, held at its hall on Spruce street, Scranton, Monday evening, March 12, 1901, it was unanimously decided that on and after April 1 all work done on buildings or repairs for any merchant or firm, unless done by union labor, will be declared unfair, and we will do all in our power throughout this valley to make these resolutions effective. The organizations in Scranton believe it is just as much benefit for merchants, builders and the public at large as it is for organizations that all work should be fair and done by union labor, and in order to avoid trouble we respectfully ask business men and builders to have all work done by union labor.

Condition of the Market.

During the past month the anthracite market has been fairly active. The demand for coal is going forward with moderate vigor, and the operators' letters. 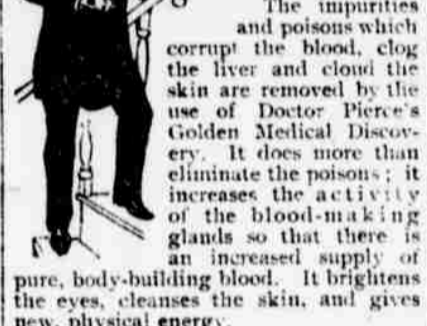
