### TAXPAYERS MUST SETTLE. The Strongest Measures Will Soon Be Taken Against Delinquents.

At the meeting of the school board on Monday evening the matter of how to get delinquent taxpayers to settle was brought up. Some strong language was used by some of the members of the board in regard to this question. Delinquent Tax Collector Seaman was present and told of some of his experiences in trying to gather in shools that should have been harvested long ago. The wrath of the board was fully aroused by his statement, and had some of the delinquent and dead taxpayers been present and listened to the threatening measures which will be used to enforce payment, they would be only too anxious to step up and pay and get out of the way of squalls.

Mr. Seaman told of one taxpayer who stated that if the board could collect from him any sooner by applying the law, to go ahead and do so. Some action will undoubtedly be taken in this case immediately by the board.

A communication from Tax Collector Clifford was read, in which he asked for thirty days more to make collections. His request was granted. A resolution was adopted that Mr. Seaman be instructed to make settlement by May 1.

Other matters that came up for the consideration of the board was what would be the requirements of the graduates of the high school, on which a special committee, consisting of Hughes, Swigert and Hockenberry, was appointed; reports of progress by

the janitors' and building committees, and the payment of the following bills:
