LLOYD GIVES HIS ANSWER.

CANNOT CONSIDER REQUEST PRESENTED TO HIM.

All Such Statements Must Come from Men Who Are Employed by the D. L. & W. Co.—That Is the Policy of the Company in All Such Matters—Answer of Humphrey B. Campbell, the Chairman of Councils, to Mr. Lloyd's Letter to Committee.

T. S. Lloyd, superintendent of motive power and machinery of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western company, yesterday sent the following letter to Humphrey B. Campbell, the chairman of the committee which last Thursday presented the request for a nine-hour day and other same wages now received for ten hours work.

Dear Sir: I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd inst. As you are not in the employ of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad company, I do not see that you have any questions affecting the hours of service or other conditions pertaining to employees of this company, which I or any other representative of the company has to discuss with you.

This company, by its proper representatives, is willing at all times to meet and discuss with any employees or other persons any questions of wages, hours of service and other regulations governing the employees of the company.

Another I myself, nor any official of this company, so far as I am concerned, have been asked by the employees of its mechanical department, or any committee consisting of its employees authorized to represent them, to meet with and discuss with such employees or committee in any manner, any question affecting wages, hours of service, etc.
