SEMI-MONTHLY PAY AT THE STEEL MILLS.

Petition of the Employees of the Lackawanna Iron and Steel Company Met with Favor—There Will Be a Meeting of the Striking Car Builders Tonight—Condition of Affairs at the Ashley Shops—Fire in the Old Jersey Mine at Plymouth Continues to Rage.

Notices have been posted at the works of the Lackawanna Iron and Steel company announcing that hereafter the company will pay the workers every two weeks.

Some time ago the men presented a petition to General Manager Wehrman, asking for a semi-monthly pay. This petition was sent on to the officers of the company in New York, where it was favorably acted upon, and to the great satisfaction of the 1,400 workmen of the company the much desired notice has been posted.

About September 1 a general office of the company will be moved from this city to Buffalo, where the new plant of the company is being erected.

Tonight a regular meeting of the union will be held in Economy hall. An amount of \$100 has been collected and the full attendance of the men still out is expected.

Situation at Ashley. The iron workers employed at the Ashley shops returned to work yesterday morning and the sound of the hammer was again heard.

Supervisor Thomas said yesterday that so far 150 applications had been received from iron workers for re-employment and about 15 men have thus far been re-employed.

Sir Charles O. Strand, Grand Recorder, having removed from the state and resigned his office, Sir D. A. Pollett has been appointed to succeed him.

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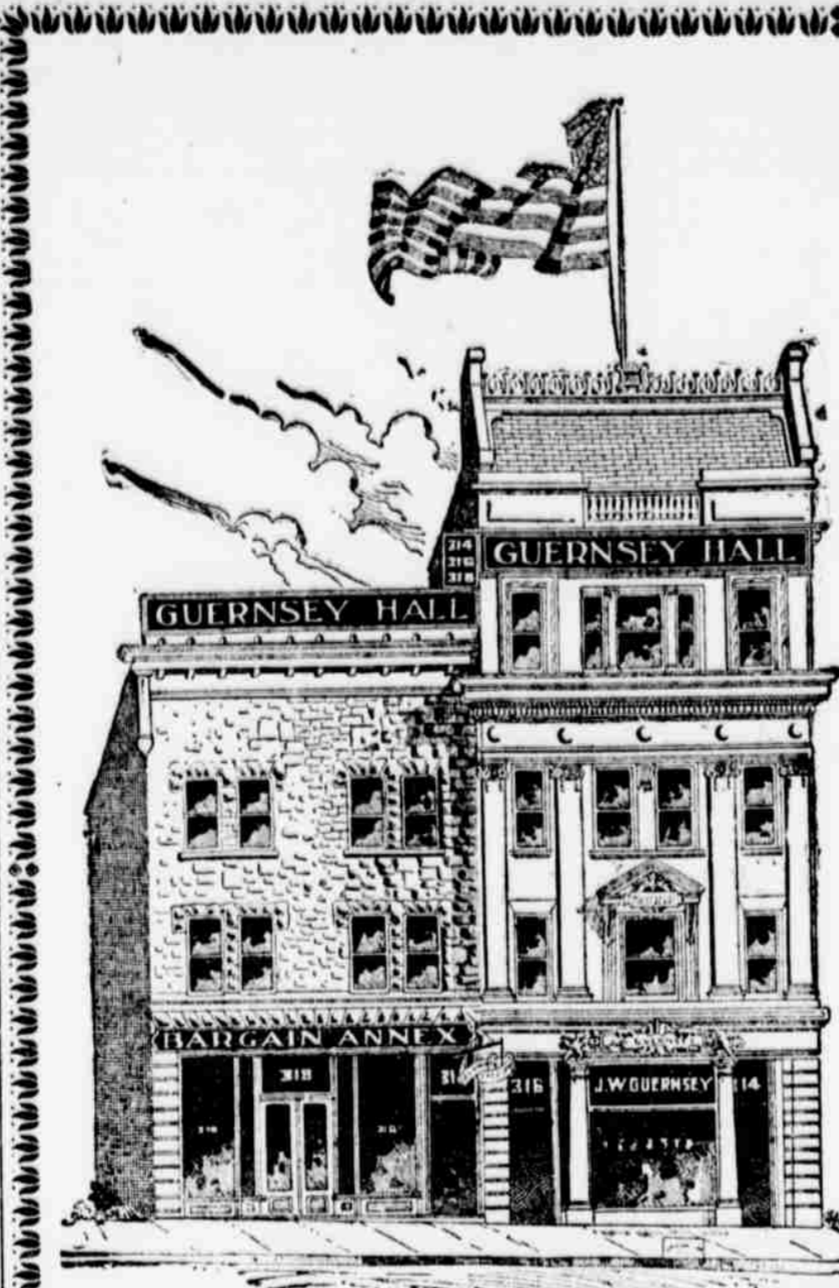
